What the summit is

Beyond the Wheels 2.0 convenes insurers, logistics operators, fleet managers, public-sector officials, driver trainers, and road-safety researchers around a common table — in a country whose road conditions and driving culture have become an economic issue the private sector can no longer treat as somebody else's problem. Its agenda spans fleet management, driver training, road-safety data, regulation, infrastructure, and the mental-health dimension of transport work.

It follows the **2025 Business Luncheon**, the smaller predecessor event that confirmed the country's appetite for a serious national conversation on road safety.

The stakes.

A larger fleet is arriving onto new corridors as oil-fuelled disposable income accelerates vehicle ownership. The gap between road capacity, driving culture, and road-safety standards is not closing on its own.
